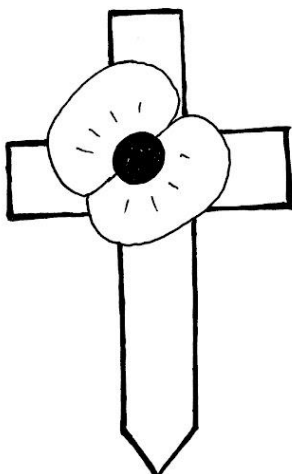

## MESSAGE FROM THE MINISTER

Dear Friends,

“Remember, remember...” A catchphrase for November? We have All Saints’ and All Souls’ Days, Bonfire Night, Armistice Day and Remembrance Sunday. Fireworks are fun, as long as we’re sensible, and considerate to both our human neighbours, and our own and others’ pets. It’s right that we remember people whom we’ve loved, who have died, because of how they have shaped us. It’s also appropriate that we remember the sacrifice of those who have given their lives in conflict. At this time, those closest to Sir David Amess MP will be remembering him as someone they loved- and his paying the ultimate price for serving others.

There’s also a saying, “Those who don’t know history, are doomed to repeat it!” Now not everybody enjoys school History. I had a wonderful, slightly zany teacher who also introduced me to Taizé and Amnesty International- and not everybody’s that fortunate. But one thing I learned was how some bits of human nature don’t change much. There’s the tendency to fight others for what we want and don’t have. There’s the tendency to let differences divide us. Sadly, Christians haven’t always set a good example in either department.

Jesus came to show us a way of generosity, a Kingdom in which differences can be strengths. I pray that this November, we will indeed remember those we have loved and lost, carry on “singing their song” while adding our harmonies (or whatever image helps us). May we remember those who have died in conflict, and let their courage inspire us. But may we also remember the lessons of history, let go of all that keeps the cycle of violence going, and work with God to build a kinder, more peaceful world.

## REQUEST ON FINANCES

**For the last two years during Covid the church has managed to provide limited access to worship on Sunday mornings.** In fact there was a period when the church was not able to be open at all. Over those two years, because we have not been able to organise any money-raising events, the only income has been the contributions made through either the Standing Order scheme that many of you belong to, or the weekly envelopes. We thank those people who give by standing order. Without that guaranteed income our finances would have suffered more than they have.

**To put it bluntly, because of the loss of income we have ended this year with a £4,500 deficit and our reserves are quickly diminishing.**

Most of our income is used up with the assessment that we are required to forward to the circuit. Our assessment at the moment is £20,850 for the financial year 20/21. This often increases, so next financial year 21/22, we are being asked to give £21,300, that's £5,325.00 per quarter.

**We have started to make plans to raise money** through a number of events over the next twelve months starting with the Recital on Friday 19th November when Renata is performing once again. We hope that is going to be the start of successful events which will hopefully bring us some needed income.

**However, a positive and supportive way in which we can make ends meet is to increase our weekly/monthly giving.** I urge you to give this some serious thought. One way is to increase your standing order if you contribute that way or, if you use the envelope system, increase the amount you put in and make sure that if you are not able to attend a service you still use the envelope and offer it the next time you attend a service.

**We are approaching the winter months and we want to be able to heat the church for our acts of worship** as well as the other occasions when we will be meeting on the premises. This, I am afraid, is the stark reality of the situation that we find ourselves in at the moment. Hopefully this time next year, if we are willing and able, we will have come through this period and be in a much better position.

**Please pray about this and consider how you can help.**
