MESSAGE FROM OUR MINISTER

Do you love yourself? The Bible encourages the love of self. When Jesus was asked to name the greatest commandment, he immediately tied together the two basic Old Testament laws of love. The first was that you should love God with all your being, the second was that you "love your neighbour as yourself". Why do people avoid, or appear to avoid loving themselves?

My first hunch is that many people identify love of self with selfishness. They do not want to say good about themselves for fear of being accused of conceit and vanity. However, having a positive self-regard is quite different from conceit.

To call attention to yourself repeatedly in monopolising conversation or some strange form of behaviour is to reveal you really do not love yourself. The conceited person's problem is precisely that he/she loves himself/herself too little, not too much.

Another hunch I have about why people do not want to love themselves is that it clashes with the Christian concept of self-denial. Some feel that we cannot both love and deny ourselves. Some Christians have identified the Gospel with self – degradation and contempt. The lower they can get the more Christian they feel.

But we can deny ourselves only as we learn to love ourselves, for false humility is a cover-up for a "bad me" image. Those who wear a mask of false humility are just as starved as those who wear the mask of conceit

People also evade loving themselves to avoid responsibility. If you say, as many do, that you are not "good enough" you won't have to take a responsibility offered to you. This is what happened to the lazy servant in the parable of talents in Matthew 25:25. Being afraid that he had nothing to give, he hid his talents in the ground. If he had been able to love himself, he could have made a profit for his Master,

We waste opportunities to be of help to fellow human beings because we did not believe ourselves "adequate" or "good enough". We did not want to take the risk of failure but rather remained sealed in the womb of inferiority. Comfortable in our little world and not daring to reach out into the human mess around us.
